Questions to Ask

While viewing each type of web page and trying to decide on one, consider the following questions

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Will I actually keep a calendar of events current? 2. Who will view this page? 3. Do students and parents have access to my site from home? 4. Will students really use the resources I provide? 5. Will I have time to update a classroom newspaper? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What kind of information would I want to communicate to my peers? 2. Do I need to have my experience (resume) information available for everyone to see? 3. How many people will really access this site? 4. Will I encourage my colleagues to look through the lessons plans I provide on my page? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How often will parents really want to access my site to see classroom policies and procedures? 2. Will I update this information when needed? 3. How often will I post new examples of student's work? 4. Will I take the time needed to provide additional resources for the students and parents?
